Suitable for children aged 12 and over. No one younger than 12 may see a '12A' film in a cinema unless accompanied by an adult (aged 18 or over).



Suitable only for people aged 15 and over. No one younger than 15 may see a '15' film in a cinema.



Films should be suitable for all audiences aged four and over.
